HAGLEY HISTORICAL AND FIELD SUCIETY.

On April 7th the members of the society were transported into the past by Mr. Homery Foulkes who gave them a picture of life 100 years ago. There were no half measures in those days; it took a cupful of tea to make six cups to drink. The 1860s were the most puritanical days since Cromwell owing to the gloom cost over them by the death of Prince Albert. Small boys were bought like slaves by sweeps and houses costing £2,500 with 20 rooms for the family (not including kitchens etc.) would have 3 bedrooms for the servents each only 10 ft square. The times seemed so leisurely in comparison with ours, but Matthew Arnold wrote of "the hurried life" and Mr.Foulkes's query was "were the people really so different from ourselves?".

On May 9th there will be an outing to Stokesay Castle in a coach starting from the Church Hall at 2 p.m. and returning about 8.p.m.Mr. Geoffrey Parkes will conduct the party round the Castle.
