

ROYAL BRITISH LEGION

VE DAY 80 On Thursday May 8th, it will be the 80th Anniversary of VE Day – Victory in Europe Day – and we will be marking the occasion in the usual way, with an Act of Remembrance at Hagley War Memorial at 9.45am. This will be followed by a VE Day Eucharist Service at St Saviours Church at 10.30am led by Fr. Tom Owen, after which coffee and cake will be served. All will be welcome at either or both these events.

BEER AND BANTER If you have ever served in the forces or are part of the forces family, this is for you. The Royal British Legion has three aims - to be Custodians of Remembrance, to provide welfare and support for exservice personnel and their families, and to facilitate Comradeship. In Blakedown and Hagley, we meet the first two objectives, with Remembrance Services at Hagley and Churchill War Memorials, and a very successful Poppy Appeal stall in Worcester Road. But we have not attracted sufficien numbers to run social events since CoVid. So we are trying something new. The King Arthur in Worcester Road have offered us the upstairs room at the pub on Wednesday,

May 21st from 7.00pm. If you fancy popping out for a swift half, and to meet up for a chat with others who have either served or are otherwise connected with the Armed Forces, just come along at or after 7pm, buy a drink at the bar, and come upstairs and join us.

We promise there will be no cost (apart from what you spend at the bar!), and we won't ask you to join the Royal British Legion or volunteer for the Poppy Appeal. We have always made it very clear that being ex-Forces is by no means necessary for being involved with the Royal British Legion – all are welcome. We owe a debt to those who served, and we hope that this event will enable us to offer comradeship to those who wish to join us. HAGLEY STRING ORCHESTRA

We will have started our summer term at Hagley String Orchestra by the time you read this, and we will be working on some new pieces. However, at the time of writing. we are coming to the end of our spring term repertoire and we are becoming really familiar with the music. One of those pieces is by Wagner, adapted for string orchestra by Maurice Johnstone, called 'Albumblatt' or Album leaf. Wagner wrote very little apart from his towering operas, which changed the course of musical history. This small piece, originally written for piano, was dedicated in gratitude to Princess Pauline Clementine von Metternich, who was a staunch and loyal supporter of Wagner's music. Unfortunately, Metternich was responsible for one of the most famous disasters in Classical Music when she persuaded Napolean III to force the Paris Opera to put on a performance of Tannhauser. The French did not like Wagner's

'modern music' and Metternich herself admitted that Wagner 'tortured the musicians to death' and was intolerable to everyone. With protests outside the theatre, Wagner himself withdrew the music after the third performance. As usual, we continue to meet on Tuesday mornings between 10am and 12, midday. THE FRIENDS OF THE CHURCH OF ST JOHN BAPTIST

My previous article outlined how, and why, "The Friends of St John" had been formed. This article provides historical facts about the Church:-The Domesday Book suggests that there was a church here in Saxon times: In the 1100s, a small stone church was built in the Norman style: Circa 1300, a new church was built with chancel. nave and south aisle: In the 18th century the Lyttleton family made Hagley their principal seat; Following this, the chancel was rebuilt and a vault constructed underneath it; Further improvements, included new windows, seating and a gallery at the west end of the church; In 1827 the church was enlarged by the addition of the North Aisle: In 1856 the church underwent a major reconstruction when the wall between the chancel and the nave was removed; The Tower and Spire were built in 1865 and a peal of eight bells was installed in 1885. With the Church facing closure, the Midlands press reported:

Stourbridge News "Heartbreak decision faces Church Members", Birmingham Post "Church faces closure threat" and "Question over St John's future" A meeting took place at Haybridge School, chaired by the Bishop of Dudley, with over 300 attending following which the County Express reported "Packed meeting vows to save Hagley Church". Today St John's still needs work to be done and "The Friends" have committed over £40K for the repair of stonework and work on the car park. Finally remember our coffee morning on the 11th June at 10.30 in St John's.

HAGLEY HISTORICAL AND FIELD SOCIETY

On April 1st we had a talk by Alan Hill, a retired manufacturing systems consultant, on 'The Great Exhibition of 1851.'

Held in Hyde Park, London, from May to October 1851, this international event was organized by Prince Albert and Henry Cole (who invented the Christmas card). It aimed to showcase Britain's industrial leadership.

The exhibition's iconic building was a marvel of iron and glass, built in just 8 months using modular, prefabricated design and was made almost exclusively in Birmingham and Smethwick. Six million people attended, and

enjoyed displays like the velocipede (precursor to the bicycle), the image telegraph (early fax machine), and the world's first pu lic toilets!



By the time you see this article I will hopefully be completing the final stages of my rehabilitation following knee surgery and I will be planning my return to work in the next few weeks. It has become very apparent to me how important being physically active before surgery is. We don't often think of the other benefits that exercise gives us but these include building a higher pain threshold, improving our ability to 'bounce back' after illness (or surgery) and to build our muscle memory - in my case for that all important rehab. When we think of exercise we tend to think of the more immediate benefit like keeping our heart healthy, keeping our asthma or diabetes under control but perhaps we also need to consider it as a way of building a 'bank balance of fitnes ' for when we may need it in the future – to help us recover from surgery or illness. Speaking from my own experience over the last few weeks I know that all those

exercises I do in class each week have enabled me to do the things that are difficul when we are recovering – simple things like getting out of a chair, up the stairs and even off the loo!! I suppose that's why people are encouraged to do some exercise pre op as it really does help!Just in case you are wondering classes in Hagley have continued whilst I've been off with colleagues who have been working hard to keep my regulars exercising each week. 
