The better weather is upon us and with that comes some seasonal updates we'd like to share. We will be hosting a 'Hagley Family Fun Day' on the playing field, over the weekend of 21st and 22nd of June. There will lots of attractions and appearances from Transformers and Dinosaur characters and much more. We'll provide more information soon, so keep an eye on our Facebook page and noticeboards around the village.

Maintenance of the playing field will take place in May where the grass will be weeded, seeded and fed and as usual we ask that you all respect our green open space, pick up your litter and use the refuse bins provided or take your rubbish home. The grass cutting schedule for around the perimeter of the playing fields area has been adjusted, in order to encourage fl wering and attract pollinators in the hope that it will allow bees and other wildlife to flourish. We ask that you please remove your dog waste and help us keep the playing fields a leasant place for all.

The Parish Council continues to work with the local policing team to focus on key areas of concern which are primarily Drugs, Antisocial Behaviour and Speeding. There have been recent arrests targeting county lines drug dealers who were operating in Hagley and surrounding villages and we'd like to thank the local policing team for their hard work so far.

HAGLEY STRING ORCHESTRA

Antonio Vivaldi (1678 - 1741) is best known for his 'four seasons', a set of four violin concertos, each depicting a different season of the year. His output was prolific, with well over 500 pieces catalogued. Whilst his detractors say that he wrote the same piece hundreds of times simply with a different combination of instruments or voices, there are many examples of passages which are strikingly bold and innovative for his time. This summer, we at Hagley Strings are looking at one of his many concertos for strings (RV 152 in G minor). While enjoying popularity in his lifetime, Vivaldi died in poverty and was buried in Vienna. His music was forgotten for a hundred and fif y years and was only rediscovered in the 20th century. Even

today, a new work is occasionally found in an Italian or central European attic. As usual, we continue to meet on Tuesday mornings between 10am and 12, midday. We are always keen to welcome new members. For further details please contact Haydn Thomas on 01562 885252

Alongside tea, coffee and lovely cakes we will welcome celebrated local pianist Michael Jones, who will be playing the piano and also the church organ. Michael will also talk about his experiences of meeting Emperor Haile Selassie.

Michael was born and musically educated entirely in Birmingham – winning a scholarship at 15 to study part-time at what is now the Birmingham Conservatoire, studying piano with Marjorie Hazlehurst. He graduated in 1974 with prizes for Piano, Advanced Harmony and Musical Distinction. After graduation Michael continued his studies privately with Janice Williams, Tom Bromley, Constance Warren, and, during the 1980s, Edna Iles, with whom he worked in detail studying various Medtner piano works.

Dubbed a "musical archaeologist" by Christopher Morley in the 'Birmingham Post', he has spent his life, in Percy Young's words: 'In Search of Music'. This has meant searching for, writing about and performing works by many neglected composers. He has also published several biographical articles and is a contributor to the New Grove and the New Dictionary of National Biography. HAGLEY HISTORICAL AND FIELD SOCIETY

On June 3rd 2025 we are delighted to welcome speaker Dr Gillian White presenting 'Bess of Hardwick and Hardwick Hall'

Bess of Hardwick is one of the most fascinating women of the sixteenth century. She was born into a family of respectable but impoverished Derbyshire landowners. She survived scandal and disgrace, four marriages, and through ambition and ability climbed the social ladder to become England's premier countess and the second richest woman in the kingdom. A friend of Elizabeth I, sometime gaoler to Mary, Queen of Scots, and grandmother to a potential queen, Bess moved adeptly throughout Elizabethan history. This talk will explore her remarkable life and the house she built – the story of a woman who simply refused to accept the boundaries of her time.

Dr. Gillian White specialises in the history and visual arts of late medieval and sixteenth-century England. She began her career at the Warwickshire Museum and then worked for the National Trust as Curator /Collections Manager at Hardwick Hall, about which she then wrote her PhD at Warwick University.

WILD ABOUT KIT

A group of mums from Hagley are diving into a fundraising challenge in memory of one of our sons, who passed away aged just 14 months. Members of the Mums Go Wild Swimming group will complete a 12-hour wild swimathon in memory of Kit Baddeley, who died from a rare mitochondrial disease last September.

The Wild About Kit swimming challenge will take place at Broadfields Lake, Cutnall Green, on Sunday, July 13 – two days after he should have been celebrating his second birthday. Funds from the swim and raffl will go to the Noah Jordan Foundation, set up in memory of another little boy, Noah, who passed away from the same condition last year at nine months. The charity funds medical research with the aim of developing a cure for Alper's disease, and also raises awareness and support for those impacted by it. Kit's parents, Gemma and Mike Baddeley, and Noah's dad, Ben, will all be taking part in the swim. Gemma said: 'Kit was a seemingly

healthy little boy until he became unwell less than a week after his first birthday and was found to have acute liver failure.

We were told he had Alper's disease and, given his age and symptoms, we were told he would deteriorate rapidly and were referred to palliative care. He passed away peacefully at home just two months after he became unwell. He was an incredibly happy, gorgeous, loving and brave little boy and we are determined to make him proud and honour his memory by raising as much money as we can to help others affected by this cruel disease and to try and find treatments and a cure.'







STOURBRIDGE LINE USER GROUP

Hagley station is described as a typical GWR country station. Although it was originally opened in 1857, the current station building on the southbound platform and footbridge date from 1884. Unfortunately, the buildings on the northbound platform from the same era were demolished in the 1970s and replaced by the now obligatory "bus shelter" style waiting room. Of course, Hagley station is best known for its ornate, canopied footbridge which was refurbished in late 2011 and repainted from

its former navy blue and white to the original GWR cream and salmon livery. It is reasonably well known that the footbridge was used by Hornby as its OO Gauge model R9751. What is less well-known is that the station building was also used by Hornby as its model R9752. Unfortunately, both models have now been discontinued by Hornby.
