ACTIVE SENIORS

An episode of the late Michael Mosleys programme on healthy ageing aired in July and had a very interesting segment on bone health. A large proportion of our older population will have the bone thinning disease – a lot of them won't know they have until they break a bone.

The programme looked at ways to improve bone health. Exercise has a big part to play – although of course medication may also be appropriate. To encourage bone growth, we need to incorporate multi directional movement in our exercise along with impact (through the heels) and some resistance exercises – like using resistance bands or using hand and leg weights. Sadly 'gentle' exercise wont 'cut the mustard' and we need to be fairly specific in our choice of exercise if we want to keep our bones strong.

In addition, we need good balance to avoid falls which can be improved by regular balance challenges and exercises to improve our co-ordination and reaction speed.

I'm happy to say that Active Seniors strength and balance classes incorporate all of this and classes are available locally at the community centre (mon/tues/thurs). Also available is tai chi on Thursday afternoons. For more details please call Angela on 07512546480.

THE FRIENDS OF THE CHURCH OF ST JOHN BAPTIST

Many readers may have recently been to Hagley Hall or Hagley Cricket Club or St John's Church and will have noticed the scaffolding that is around parts of the Church. This is because, following a Worcester Diocese Quinquennial Report, defects were found to the Church stonework. Hagley Parochial Church Council (PCC), who are responsible for the maintenance of St John's, appointed "Jones Chartered Architects of Cookley" to draw up plans to repair or replace those parts affected.

Given the amount involved - over £30,000 - "The Friends of St John's" agreed to cover all the costs with the exception of any VAT which the PCC will cover. It is hoped that the VAT may be refunded by HMRC through a specialist scheme relating to historical buildings. Work on the Church commenced late March by "Steve Allard and Son, Stonemasons from Worcester", and the work was completed mid-July.

In addition to the work mentioned "The Friends" have recently funded work – almost £10,000 - on the car park adjacent to St John's Church. This has involved excavating the stoned area to a depth of 60mm and resurfacing with 60mm of 20mm binder course. Work also included excavating the grassed area to 150mm depth and laying new stone to get a finished level. It is expected that this work will alleviate heavy ground after prolonged rainfall.



WHAT THE DRAFT DEVELOPMENT STRATEGY COULD MEAN FOR HAGLEY

Hagley is classed as one of the large, sustainable settlements in the current Bromsgrove District Plan and benefits from a railway station on the Wyre Valley and Leamington-Worcester Lines, with good vehicular access to Bromsgrove, the wider Worcestershire area and the West Midlands conurbation. Hagley benefits from a thriving local centre, supported by a range of hospitality venues with good social infrastructure such as school provision and community facilities, making it appropriate for future development allocations as identified in our draft Development Strategy.

All the sites that were submitted around Hagley were assessed and our conclusions can be found in 'Appendix 5: Hagley' of the 'Site Assessments: An assessment and analysis of submitted development sites — Output Summaries' document, which can be found at www.bromsgrove.gov.uk/SAASSM

There is a map in the document link above that shows the individual sites that were assessed, some of which we have combined to create an overall allocation site, such as HAG01 depicted on the map opposite. You will also find the rationale for our site assessments regarding each site's potential for development.

Ecological and Biodiversity Concerns

Sites One and Two fields behind Western and Newfield Road:

Ecological surveys (Appendix A of the Environment Report) found that both sites contain important environmental features worth preserving.

Site Two, in particular, offers more tailored conservation opportunities, but both are recommended for conservation and biodiversity enhancement, rather than development.

General Biodiversity Risk:

Development threatens wildlife corridors, particularly near Sweet Pool, Brake Mill Pond, and Hagley Wood.
Urban encroachment is fragmenting habitats, which reduces the movement of species and increases their extinction risk.





Protected and At-Risk Species

Species found in or near the sites include:

- · Skylark, yellowhammer, lapwing (Red List)
- Great Crested Newt (European Protected Species)
 Habitat loss would violate biodiversity net gain policies under national law.

Flood Risk & Water Management

Hagley West lies within Flood Zone 3 (Environment Agency 2025).

Development would increase runoff and strain existing flood defences and water systems, which are already noted as problematic.

Property value will be effected and residents would be faced with home insurance challenges.

Agricultural Land Value

Both sites include Best and Most Versatile (BMV) agricultural land.

Grade 2 and Subgrade 3a land make up over 67% of the area surveyed between Hagley and the railway.

Development would compromise prime farmland that has planning protections under national policy.

Green Belt & Landscape Protection

The land lies within or adjacent to the Green Belt, whose purpose is to prevent sprawl and preserve the countryside.

Hagley lost its Landscape Protection Area (LPA) status in 2017, increasing vulnerability to inappropriate development.

National policy no longer requires Green Belt review unless "exceptional circumstances" arise—which this report implies have not been met.

Hagley faces health issues such as:


Green spaces have been proven to improve both mental and physical health. Residents strongly support preserving green spaces and oppose urban sprawl, as shown in community consultations.

Summary

Sites One and Two should not be developed because they:

- · Are ecologically rich
- · Contain protected species
- · Lie on high-quality farmland
- · Are within the Green Belt
- · Are at risk of flooding
- . The community values them for their health and
- · recreational benefits.

These concerns collectively align with national planning policies (NPPF 2024) and Hagley's own Biodiversity and Environment Plan, supporting environmental protection and sustainable development.

Existing Issues

- 4 major road junctions and 2 significant national transport corridors
- WCC traffic counts show c36,000 vehicles per working day pass through
- WCC accept "capacity constraints at A456 junctions in Hagley" and "the route is now at capacity"
- · Speeding is high as shown in WCC data
- Rat Running very common particularly Western/Newfield Road, Stakenbridge Lane and Pinewoods Avenue
- School traffic on Station Road frequently causes severe delays
- No new traffic model has been available to forecast impact of new development





Parking

- Parking provision in the village centre remains inadequate
- Studies shows Friday evenings and Saturday mornings are worst
- High amount of illegal and dangerous parking observed
- Anecdotally shops suffer from lost footfall due to lack of parking
- Small improvements may be possible but not able to cope with the 920 extra cars from a new development
- Train station car park is underutilised since the introduction of pay-to-park






Hagley is not sustainable

- Train station is seen as a significant factor making Hagley suitable for development
- However, train service is extremely poor with a high level of regular customer complaints
- · Trains often have reduced capacity
- · Trains are currently two per hour off peak, not three as stated
- · 3 bus services, poor service, not well supported but essential to some
- . Community bus only sustained by developer contributions which are running out
- · No real cycleways, few cyclists feel confident using the main roads
- Footways are narrow on some main roads (egA456) and in poor condition (WCC will only react if dangerous trip hazard identified)

Just 6% of residents use the train to commute, 70% use their car



Newfield & Western Road

- Newfield Road junction with A456 suffers severe congestion at peak hours
- Western Road junction with A491 has a history of accidents
- It is clear that both junctions need major improvement if development goes ahead
- It is true that developer contributions may be available BUT they are not expected to cover a large proportion of the cost
- · Where is the rest coming from? Is it guaranteed? No!









Traffic Flow Newfield Road / A456 Junction

Residents complained of queues at peak times so a one week study was undertaken

- · A residential road not intended for through traffic
- Evening queues worse than morning anything up to 63 cars in the queue, taking up to 13.5 minutes to clear
- The average number of cars over the week, morning and evening sessions represented 105 and 250 per hour
- Over 95% of cars in the evening turned left in the direction of Kidderminster and could therefore be deemed to be 'through-traffic'




Current traffic queue length

Housing Needs





Hagley requires additional housing as evidenced by the Housing Needs survey and the Hagley Census. The key findings were:

The outputs from the independent surveys pointed to an overwhelming need for small, 1-2 bed dwellings, located close to the village centre amenities such as the GP, shops and schools, and being able to live independently for longer.

Respondents said that they have lived in Hagley all their lives and wanted to stay close to family and friends but needed to downsize.

Having an alternative to the motor vehicle was important in later life, but having access to the train station and bus routes was recognised as being important to avoid being isolated and becoming vulnerable.

There is a clear need for affordable housing to meet local needs.

The quantum of housing need is assumed to be between 80-100 dwellings.

The historic housing mix has been developer led, based on demand for larger 3, 4 and 5 bed executive houses from people wanting to take advantage of Hagley's amenities.

Overtime these benefits have become unsustainable leading to a housing mix that does not support the needlest family cohorts.

First homes discounts would help ensure target groups into affordable homes.

Respondents highlighted the need for younger families to have a good start close to schools, doctors, family, friends and jobs.





HAGLEY PROBUS CLUB

Max Hunt, a keen Morgan Car enthusiast, entertained us with the chequered history of The Morgan Motor Company. Henry (HFS) Morgan, born in 1881 was the son of a curate who lived in Stoke Lacy. Schooled in Kent, it soon became apparent he had an inventive mind and spirit.

After school he enrolled at the Crystal Palace school of engineering before taking up an apprenticeship at the Great Western Railway Company. His father financed the establishment of The Morgan Garage & Motor works. in 1906, However, HFS quickly turned his attention to producing cars and in 1910 introduced his first 3-wheeler followed by a trials car in 1914. Post war, family and police cars followed and in 1926 the traditional 3-wheeler. The Pickering Road factory was opened in the 1920s and 1938 his car finished

19th in the Le Mans 24 hour. Post 2nd world war saw further development with his son, Peter, taking over in the 1950s. Unfortunately, the company lacked sufficien resources to stay independent and in 2019 was taken over by the Italian investment group Investingustrial

BEE KEEPING
