Whilst we welcome in Autumn, we have decided to introduce a brand-new community event called 'HAGLEY APPLE DAY'. Councillor Lawson had seen something similar in a neighbouring Parish and now our own event is happening. Hagley Apple Day will take place on Sunday 12th October, 10am - 4pm at the Pavilion on the playing field. Bring along apples and we'll press them into fresh juice. If you don't have apples don't worry, we'll have plenty of stock - vou'll need to bring containers, so start saving milk bottles now! It's also a fun opportunity for any youngsters out there who want to have a go and learn the art of apple pressing and create locally sourced fresh juice. If you have a stock of apples that you don't want, please get in touch and we can collect them a few days before the event or you can bring them along on the day.

In other news, we've started planning our annual 'Christmas in Hagley' event and we're very pleased to announce that it will take place on Saturday 29th November. We'll share more details closer to the time but for now, put the date in your diary.

MOST POPULAR CHILDREN'S NAMES IN HAGLEY

(1538 -1599) The names listed below come from the Parish register of 1538, a time when spelling was inconsistent and often varied. As a result, the different spelling variations for each name are included.

Girls' Names: A total of 74 girls are recorded, with 23 different names. The most popular are: 14 named Ann (also Anne)

11 named Elizabeth (spelled Elyzabeth, Eliza, or Elyzbeth)

6 named Mary (spelled Marye)

5 named Margaret (spelled Margrit)

5 named Margery (spelled Margeri or Margerye)

Other names include: Frances (also Franses), Jane (Jahan), Martha, Isabell (Sybell), Bennett, Bridgett (spelled Brydgett), Joyce (spelled Joyse), Judith (Judyth), Lettis, Elenor, Agnes, Sara, Maudlen, Alse, Christia, Ursula, and Cecely.

Boys' Names: There are 102 boys listed with 19 different names. The most popular are: 21 named William (spelled Wyllm or Willm) 20 named John (spelled Jhon)

13 named Richard (spelled Rychard)

12 named Thomas (spelled Thoms or Tho) 7 named Humphrey (spelled Homfrey or Humfrey)

5 named Nicholas (spelled Nycolas) 5 named Frances

Other names include: Henry, Roger, George, Edward, Adam, Gersom, Gilbart, Matthew, Mordonias, Mychael, Symo, and Xpofer (likely referring to Christopher).

A Note on Naming Practices: It's important to remember that in the 16th century, infant mortality was high, especially among boys. As a result, many families would name later children after siblings who had passed away. In fact, there are at least 15 children in this list were named after a deceased sibling.

Looking at these names, it's clear that many were family names, especially for the eldest children. Some of these names have continued to be popular today, while others have fallen out of fashion.



Max Hunt, a keen Morgan Car enthusiast, entertained us with the chequered history of The Morgan Motor Company. Henry (HFS) Morgan, born in 1881 was the son of a curate who lived in Stoke Lacy. Schooled in Kent, it soon became apparent he had an inventive mind and spirit. After school he enrolled at the Crystal Palace school of engineering before taking up an apprenticeship at the Great Western Railway Company. His father financed the establishment of The Morgan Garage & Motor works. in 1906, However, HFS quickly turned his attention to producing cars and in 1910 introduced his first 3-wheeler followed by a trials car in 1914. Post war, family and police cars followed and in 1926 the traditional 3-wheeler. The Pickering Road factory was opened in the 1920s and 1938

his car finished 19th in the Le Mans 24 hour. Post 2nd world war saw further development with his son, Peter, taking over in the 1950s. Unfortunately, the company lacked sufficien resources to stay independent and in 2019 was taken over by the Italian investment group Investindustrial
