#### HAGLEY HISTORICAL AND FIELD SOCIETY

On 3rd September we welcome Ned Williams presenting 'A Perfect Place to Live: New Towns and Utopias'. The New Towns programme, with its phases between 1946 and 1970, was the most ambitious town building programme ever undertaken in the United Kingdom. The first wave of independent new towns was intended to help alleviate the housing shortages following the Second World War in and around London. Additional phases occurred in the Midlands and the North, including the new towns closest to home, Telford and Redditch

When describing the new towns, we often refer to the utopian thinking that birthed them. However, utopias are 'no places'; and sadly, they are imaginary and impossible to realise. This talk takes us back to a time in our history an ideal existed – to create greener, more spacious, more prosperous places for all social classes to live in together. Come along and assess how planners attempted to achieve this, and judge how well they succeeded!

On 1st of October, after a very short AGM, our speaker will be Andrew Lound introducing 'Shackleton: By Endurance We Conquer'. Endurance, which sank in 1915 was lost to

the deep in when it became trapped and holed by thick Antarctic sea-ice. The story of how Shackleton then managed to get all his exploration team to safety is the stuff of legend. Endurance is one of the standout symbols of the so-called Heroic Age of Antarctic exploration, with a story which has captivated the world for decades. This is an unusually topical talk for the society! The wreck of the Endurance was only rediscovered in 2022 after being considered the single most difficult wreck to find anywhere on the globe.

The society's meetings which are held at 8pm in St Saviour's Hall on the first Tuesday of each month.



#### THE ANCIENT CRAFT OF

# BELLRINGING

#### AN ENGLISH TRADITION - A SERVICE TO THE COMMUNITY

Ringing of bells has been happening for many hundreds of years but has developed into a style that is truly English. Ringing does take place in other countries with many of their installations having been made by English bell founders and rung in the English change ringing style.

Control of the bell is by a rope and one person, even heavy bells weighing over a ton (2240lbs). It is swung through 360 degrees and set with the mouth open, i.e. bell up usually by means of stay and slider. The bell is raised gradually at the beginning of ringing and lowered gradually at the end of ringing. This procedure is for safety; accidents are thankfully rare. The combination of heavy metal and ropes could be very dangerous.

There are different customs associated with ringing that you may have heard of. Half or fully muffled ringing: where a leather pad is fastened to the clapper to produce a beautiful quiet echo. Two muffles are fitted for fully muffled ringing with one side of the tenor, the heaviest bell, left unmuffled or open. All towers usually ring half muffled for Remembrance Sunday. Funeral tolling is not so common these days but in years passed when time was observed by church bells, the populace could tell if a man or woman had died and how old they were. These days bells are rung for weddings, notable events and recreation. Associations of ringers often have outings where ringers visit other towers and ring, sometimes several towers in a day.

Prior to 1681, St Leonard's, Clent had four bells but in that year they were taken down and recast with the addition of a fifth bell. A sixth bell was added is 1701, but was found to be unsatisfactory and was recast in 1702. The tenor bell later developed a crack and was recast in 1743. At the close of the 19th century the bells weren't going well and were rehung in a new cast iron frame in 1902, with the addition of two new trebles, making a peal of eight. Two local families donated these bells, Chance and Thatcher. The Taylor foundry at Loughborough did the work and they continue to maintain the bells today.

The weight of bells is given in hundredweights (cwt), quarters and pounds of the heaviest bell, the tenor. At Clent this is 11cwt 0qr and 18lbs. The total weight of all the bells is 47 cwt. They are decorated with inscriptions of founder's names, decorations and dates. The wheels are made from oak and date from 1902. New ropes were fitted about 5 years ago.

Bells are rung by mathematically constructed permutations. Ringers do not have music in front of them, just the method and work committed to memory. No bell strikes more than twice in the same place in succession, except where it is making long places i.e., four blows in the same place to enable bells in front to do their required work. There are rules for ringing methods where the bells are called to change position with another bell and these methods are given names according to what is being rung and by how many bells. For example: changes on 5 bells are called doubles, on 6 minor, on 7 triples, on 8 major. A peal can take around three hours on eight bells and involves a minimum of 5040 changes. There would also be a conductor ringing to monitor the process and give the calls of when and what to change. Quarter peals are popular and take around 40-50 minutes involving 1260 changes on 6 bells. You may have seen peal boards hanging on walls in churches - these detail the ringers, dates, methods and purpose.

The social side of bell ringing includes quiz evenings, outings, tea meetings, skittles, carol services, an annual dinner and tutorials on all aspects of ringing. It is not unknown for towers to finish a practice meeting at a local pub! If you feel you would like to know more about this "heavy metal" music made by the loudest unamplified instruments in the world, there are local towers who would welcome the opportunity to show you "how it works". Clent, Chaddesley Corbett, Hagley and Belbroughton all have bells and welcome learners. Further afield, the towers of Bromsgrove, Kidderminster and Stourbridge are all equally as receptive.

Learning to ring can take several months to master and longer to become proficient with different methods. The learning never stops!

I'm trying again to arrange a public meeting with the Policing Team, probably in early October after the holiday season. I will advertise this meeting as soon and as widely as possible. During the summer there have been reports of characters acting suspiciously and coinciding with either theft of a vehicle or burglary. As a reminder, such incidents can

be reported to 101 as this will build up much needed intelligence before a crime happens. Being vigilant and having strong links to the local policing team is the key to making our streets safer and discouraging would be criminals at all times. Please remember to tell neighbours and friends if you're going away and help each other to be safe at all times. #### **HAGLEY COMMUNITY CENTRE**

We're looking forward to planning the repair and maintenance work over the next few months. This follows the successful bid for support from a 'Community Interest Company' and monies raised from the Monthly Village Market. We will be co-ordinating these essential works around the calendar and hirers, being mindful of minimising disruption as well as completing these works as soon as possible. When one village market finishes our volunteer team start to plan for the next month. We have been actively seeking out different traders that meet our criteria so that we have a variety of trades throughout the year. We have between 400-600 visitors each month and income from the markets has grown to over £6,000 since it started.

#### **HAGLEY SURGERY PPG**

At the last PPG meeting we met the senior clinician and management of Hagley surgery at which we were able to get an update on some Performance indicators for the surgery. It was interesting to see that just for the month of May 2024 there were 1075 GP face to face appointments and 1101 GP telephone calls with patients. There were also 27 patients that did not attend their appointments. For the same period 1260 appointments were attended to see the nurse, whilst 181 appointments with the nurse were conducted via a telephone call. 73 appointments with the nurse were not attended. 411 referrals were made from the practice in May and 4181 prescription requests were fulfilled. Accessing the doctor's surgery for a consultation, advice or ordering repeat prescriptions is a common question raised to both the surgery and the

PPG. The advice is that calling the surgery direct is always an option especially for those with no access to the NHS App or the surgery website. These calls can be made during office hours but might be subject to waiting in a queue to be answered.

The website offers the same service but virtually and in both access systems your call will be triaged to get you to the most appropriate person to resolve your call. The NHS App is another preferred option and once logged on you can order repeat prescriptions, book and manage appointments, get health information and advice and view your health record securely. In every case the surgery reception will be happy to help support where it is needed.







Insects only have three seasons, Dormant, Flowering and Fruiting. We are in the Flowering season now, it started around the middle of January; you glimpse a patch of Snowdrops and you know Flowering has arrived. The season lasts until near the end of July. The astounding thing about honeybees is that after a windy, wet, cold, and generally dreadful Dormant season, these incredible insects have survived in their colony of about ten thousand individuals, just waiting for the days to lengthen and flowers to emerge, it's their numbers that make honeybees so important for our ecosystem. **www.hsbka.org and search via Events** 

#### **ACTIVE SENIORS**

There was recently a very interesting article in the Guardian entitled "The power of proprioception" or your "sixth sense". Maintaining this as we age is essential to our quality of life. Its what lets you touch your nose with your eyes closed but perhaps more importantly as we get older, adjust our step and speed of response when our foot hits an unexpected root as we walk a path or detect a change in surface you are walking on without looking down. As a consequence, good proprioception can reduce our risk of falls as we are more aware of our position in space.

So how can we improve this? Exercise! Add more movements to your day, include things that challenge your balance, hand to eye coordination, exercise to work on your posture, changing weight from one foot to the other. Recent studies suggest that tai chi can be

effective for building proprioception with its changes in direction and deliberate slow controlled movements. But in our strength and balance classes we also practice these skills too. So the good news is you can improve with the right sort of exercise and this in turn will help with injury prevention, improved co-ordination to enjoy everyday activities and reduce falls risk in the future.

#### **HAGLEY VILLAGE ALLOTMENTS**

There's something about home grown tomatoes isn't there? They are often as close to those that you get in the Mediterranean as you can get – particularly at this time of year! They smell how a tomato should smell, they taste as you would hope and although they may not have the perfection of many of the supermarket sold tomatoes – that is definitely part of their charm!

Each year's glut (such an ugly word for what is actually a positive experience!), I go back to Thane Prince's book 'Preserves, Pickles and Cures". Once you have sterilised your jars it involves a two-stage process. The first involves judicious salting of your halved tomatoes for 24-48 hours to encourage water loss and dehydration, before seasoning with pepper and dried herbs and then slow cooking on a low oven for many hours (or in a dehydrator). Once sufficiently dried, add them to the jars and top up with good quality olive oil and have them for the many months to come!

I have already started picking and preserving the chillies for the later months. I am a big fan of any pickled vegetable! Pickled jalapenos are really a treasure in the fridge to add to any dish. I find freezing them whole and grating them over dishes or into sauces, or even freezing them pre-sliced, really adds to the

convenience of storing them in your freezer. Make sure you label them – no one wants a dish ruined by the chilli sweats - or worse still - the Williams signature profound and violent hiccups...




#### **HAGLEY COUNTRY DANCERS**


