

HAGLEY HISTORICAL AND FIELD SOCIETY

On 3rd December we welcome popular speaker Max Keen who in full costume (as always!) will be presenting 'Alfred the Great: A King Who Rode Good Fortune?'

Alfred, born in 849 - stands alone of all the English kings and queens to be known as 'the Great'. One of the best known stories in English history is that of King Alfred and the cakes. Children are taught the story where Alfred is on the run from the Vikings, taking refuge in the home of a peasant woman. She asks him to watch her cakes baking by the fi e, but distracted by his problems, he lets the cakes burn and is scolded by the woman. More importantly, this Saxon king is remembered for his valiant defence of his kingdom against a stronger enemy, for securing peace with the Vikings and for his farsighted reforms in the reconstruction of his kingdom. How much of this was down to 'lady luck'? Come along and find out!

On 7th of January, we welcome Phil Downing presenting 'Harvington Hall: Discover the House of Secrets' Only 6 miles from Hagley, Harvington Hall has one the country's finest collection of priest hides. During the reign of Elizabeth I, wealthy Catholics had to come up with ways of keeping priests safe from the

priest hunters, who were permitted to search houses looking for them. Priest hides were secret hiding places built within the house for a priest to hide, sometimes for over a week! Conditions would be cramped, cold and dark. It must have felt terrifying hiding in the pitch black knowing that when the house fell silent, the priest hunters were waiting to hear any sound. It was a real-life game of hide-and-seek, with terrifying consequences for any priest caught.

Phil, who is the manager of Harvington Hall (and has spent 36 hours hidden in one of the hall's priest hides) will share his experiences and tales from 'The House of Secrets' in what is bound to be an entertaining talk.

HAGLEY PARISH COUNCIL

As you may know, Hagley Parish Council owns the playing fields, the cemetery, the allotments and the war memorial site, as well as helping to manage the land at the Sweetpool Nature Reserve under a licence from Bromsgrove District Council.

We aim to maintain everything to a good standard and over the past year we've been making improvements to all areas including the playing fields. The signage has been updated as the previous ones had been in place for many years and looked worse for wear. We've secured Government funding and resurfaced the zip wire area and more recently our very own Councillor Suhayla Lawson made some large planters from railway sleepers, that are situated in front of the Pavilion.

Next year we plan to re-wild around the perimeter which we've done for a couple of years now, and it also forms part of our commitment to Biodiversity. See our website for full details of our Biodiversity policy.

We can't achieve everything without the support of residents, so we'd like to remind you to pick up and dispose of your dog waste responsibility and put litter in the bins or take it home

We're also embarking upon a wildfl wer project that will give us not just splashes of colour, but a much-needed ecological restoration and an attempt to rejuvenate the number of pollinating insects. Bromsgrove District Council are preparing areas of ground for seed, for example the island at the top of Park Road near the War Memorial, and we'll be sowing the seed which will in turn regenerate the soil for ongoing further planting. It should look really good in the spring/summer.

As the daylight hours have reduced, we'd like to remind our residents about being vigilant with home security. Make sure that your homes have plenty of lighting, valuables are not left in your cars and that they're securely locked.

We would like to wish all the residents a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

HAGLEY HOBBLERS


The group, now largely self run, was established in 2022 under a wider walking football initiative by Bromsgrove and Redditch District Council, with support from Hagley Parish Council. Initial funding paid for the necessary equipment (footballs, playing bibs etc). The group was brought together and run for the first 3 months by volunteer Alex Cooke and since then has been largely self run with District and Parish Council support. The facilities at Hagley Playing Fields, both the Pavilion and the playing fields, are provided by Hagley Parish Council, and West Hagley Football Club supply goal posts and flags. Games take place every Tuesday at 10.30am (weather permitting). Everyone who turns up is guaranteed a game - the number in each team and the size of the pitch is adjusted accordingly. The only rule is 'just turn up on Tuesday for 10.30am' - no prior notice or future commitment required. The rules of walking football are fairly simple, with some appropriate adjustments from ordinary football - mainly 'no running'!


STEP BACK IN TIME OLD SHOPS OF HAGLEY

159 WORCESTER ROAD

This was a general shop from which milk was delivered by Mary Forrest. Another dairyman was Mr Newman who together with Land Army girls sold milk from here. By 1940 Mrs Louise White and Mary Roberts had set up the Lyttelton Cafe with its sign of a Hovis loaf backed by a setting sun. Mrs Roberts baked cakes in the huge oven

and sold them in the shop. In the early 1960's Mr and Mrs Woodhouse and their daughter set up an excellent grocery shop where Brenda specialised in unusual cheeses. It was known as The End Shop. In 1969 the owners of the property, Mr and Mrs Genner carried on the business for a further year.





Penny Bright took over in 1971 and opened an antique shop which she extended to include a cafe. In 1982 it was known as The Village Restaurant. David Fook Hing Tsang became the new owner in 1985 and opened the Rickshaw, a Cantonese Restaurant. On his death in 1999 it became the Retreat Bar θ Bistro until it was replaced by the present West One.

HAGLEY SURGERY PPG

There were 948 GP face to face appointments and 704 GP Telephoned appointment calls made; unfortunately, there were 17 GP Appointments where the patient did not attend; there were 1493 nurse appointments, and 123 nurse telephone appointments made; unfortunately, there were 53 appointments with the nurse which the patient did not attend; there were 431 referrals; 4122 prescription requests; and 931 online requests triaged. If you are unable to make an appointment whether it was with a nurse or GP, please contact the surgery and cancel as soon as possible as they

might be able to reschedule another patient to take the appointments slot.

The surgery completed the Covid and Flu vaccines in November with many comments that the whole process was quick and efficien Thank you to PPG members who were able to lend a hand.

HAGLEY NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

I'm aware that several areas in Hagley have set up WhatsApp groups and have benefi ed from being able to raise issues immediately alerting group members to issues as they arise. These Whatsapp groups don't have to be large, but just to cover a road, or culde-sac, or street. It's a great way of letting neighbours know if you're going away or if there is any suspicious behaviour going on.

Please don't forget those that might not use social media and keep in close contact with them to check that everything is ok, especially now that we're in winter and vulnerable and lonely people retreat further when days become shorter. Also, there's nothing like a quick chat on the doorstep making sure neighbours and friends are well and keeping safe.

Police reports have reduced over the last few months, and it might be a timely reminder to report suspicious behaviour as soon as possible to 101, even if you are unsure. It's better to be safe than sorry as you just might be witnessing something that could turn into something more serious.

The usual winter and Christmas warnings apply. Don't forget to ensure that a lamp or two is left on if you're out after dark, tell neighbours if you're going away, and don't leave valuables and Christmas presents in vehicles in clear open sight. It's easy for well-intended gifts left in vehicles to end up with someone that they're not intended for.



The Reverend Richard Mudge is not a name that will be known, even to well-versed scholars of music. He was born in 1718 the third of five children, to Zecariah and Marv Mudge, and was educated at Pembroke College, Oxford. He earned his crust in the Church, acting as curate in the villages of Great and Little Packington and then for a time as a priest in Birmingham. Not a great deal is known of his musical education, but in 1749 he published a set of 6 string concertos in the baroque style of Handel, who was at the height of fashion at the time. Hagley String Orchestra has been playing the first of these concertos and we have found it interesting and worthy of wider recognition. The writing shows a great deal of skill and stands comparison with more well-known composers of the time. Perhaps his meagre output has not helped his reputation, but

who knows if there are more manuscripts to be discovered in the attics of old houses in Birmingham and Packington?



BEE KEEPING


