

HAGLEY HISTORICAL AND FIELD SOCIETY

On 7th of January, we welcome Phil Downing presenting 'Harvington Hall: Discover the House of Secrets'. Only 6 miles from Hagley, Harvington Hall has one the country's finest collection of priest hides. During the reign of Elizabeth I, wealthy Catholics had to come up with ways of keeping priests safe from the priest hunters, who were permitted to search houses looking for them. Priest hides were secret places built within the house for a priest to be hidden, sometimes for over a week! Conditions would be cramped cold and dark. It must have felt terrifying hiding in the pitch black aware that when the house fell silent, the priest hunters were waiting to hear any sound. It was a real-life game of hideand-seek, with dreadful consequences for any priest caught. Phil, who is the manager of Harvington Hall (and has spent 36 hours hidden in one of the hall's priest hides) will share his experiences and tales from 'The House of Secrets' in what is bound to be an entertaining talk.

On 4th February we welcome Mary Bodfish, presenting 'Early Years at Soho'. You may be familiar with the gilded bronze state of three

entrepreneurs which stands in Centenary Square Birmingham, known locally as 'the Golden Boys'. In the 1760s, entrepreneur Matthew Boulton chose a site near Hockley Brook, Handsworth to build his home and factory. At first, he made small metal goods called 'toys', pioneering mass production on the assembly line principle. Later, when he met James Watt and William Murdock and the factory expanded to produce the steam engines that pumped water out of mines. This lively and fascinating talk will acknowledge the pivotal role Boulton, Watt and Murdock and the Soho factory had on the start of the industrial revolution



HAGLEY PROBUS CLUB

On November 26 did anyone see Sir Oliver Cromwell in Hagley? Well, I did, along with 44 others who were members and guests at our November meeting. His presence was in the persona of Max Keen, a retired history teacher, who dressed in the uniform of Cromwell. complete with spurs and helmet.

Before becoming involved in politics, Cromwell (nee 1599) was a farmer in Huntingdon, married with 9 children. These were turbulent times, with the country divided by religion and the King at odds with Parliament. In 1629 Charles I dissolved Parliament and at this point Cromwell, being opposed to the King's autocratic rule, joined the uprising against him and Civil War broke out. Cromwell raised an army, and the first battle of the War was fought at Powick Bridge. Subsequent battles were fought at Marston

Moore and then at Naseby in 1647 when the Royalists were routed. Charles I was executed, and Charles II became King but was defeated at the battle of Worcester and fled to France. England then became a Commonwealth. Cromwell died in 1658.



According to West Mercia Police 'Top reported Crimes' for October 2024 Hagley and Rubery | Your area | West Mercia Police | West Mercia Police there were 37 Violence and sexual offences, 21 Shoplifting crimes, 18 Vehicle crimes and 12 Anti-social behaviour crimes reported in Hagley.

I have asked the Policing Team to do their 'drop-in' sessions at the monthly Hagley Village Market as I feel that this gives a much greater opportunity to engage with more people and increase the Policing Teams visibility in Hagley.

I have once again raised the request for regular speed checks to be held on the A456 outside Webbs Garden Centre, especially following the latest road traffi accident at the junction of Broome Lane and Kidderminster Road.

On a similar note, I'm continuing to press for the establishment of a Community Street Watch here in Hagley. The response I have most recently is that the scheme has been paused and the relaunch date is unknown.

Generally, I would like to see more activity and support from the Policing Team in terms of the Neighbourhood Watch and what this could achieve given greater support.

A further initiative I can see benefiting from the principles of the Neighbourhood Watch is to work with partners in areas of being a neighbourly watch over the health and wellbeing of the most vulnerable, elderly and isolated members of our community. How this can be rolled out is being discussed with some community partners.

THE ANCIENT CRAFT OF BELLRINGING

MORE FOR YOU TO KNOW ABOUT THIS BEAUTIFUL ART

FOLLOWING ON FROM THE ARTICLE IN THE SEPTEMBER 2024 HAGLEY VILLAGE NEWS, I DECIDED THERE IS MORE TO OFFER......

I mentioned the weight of the tenor bell at St Leonard's, Clent. This is the heaviest of the eight bells at just over 11cwt, nearly 600kg with a diameter of approx. 41 inches, just over 104cms. It was cast in 1743 during the reign of King George the Second. The rope that controls the bell is attached to the headstock that holds the bell by means of a wheel. The rope is made from hemp, a natural fib e with great strength. The upper part is made from pre stretched polyester and is spliced to the hemp length. The fluff woollen part known as the sally is used by the ringer to control the hand stroke and is woven into the lower part of the rope. The wheel is made in two parts and constructed from oak, elm and ash. All having different properties necessary for successful ringing.

There are many terms used in bellringing that seem to come from a different language. Hand stroke, sally stroke, tail stroke, back stroke. Headstock, not a device for punishment. Cannons, not for firing. Gudgeons, nothing to do with fish. Shrouding, twiddle pins, stays and dinglers are some others.

When you hear church bells ringing, do you wonder why they are ringing, who is ringing them or how many? Can you count them?

Then we have door bells, cycle bells, telephone bells, cow bells, hare bells, bathing belles, jingle bells, alarm bells and hand bells with their associated skills and terminology. Legato, vibrato, ottava and accidentals. We have a team of handbell ringers at Clent and there is a group at St John's. St Leonard's Ensemble have

played for Harvest Festival services at Clent and Fairfield and are booked to play for Advent services at both St Leonard's and St Mark's. Anyone know of a cheap tour bus?

You may have noticed no mention of the term "campanology", an often-misused term that is more to do with the scientific and musical study of ringing.

Handbell music can be written in different formats whilst tower bell ringers commit to memory the work of their bell, whether it be for a quarter peal, full peal or whatever the chosen method is. This is done without written cues, sometimes for three hours or more. No mean feat!

Carillons are mainly found on the continent and consist of a number of bells hung in a frame and rung by a carillonneur who operates a lever that controls a clapper that strikes the bell

Bellringing is a serious commitment and is a thoroughly enjoyable hobby. We are very grateful to the incumbents of the churches where we ring to further the call to worship and to keep the bells ringing. HAGLEY VILLAGE ALLOTMENTS

Storm Bert really did a number on many of the plots at the allotment last week. This 12 months of inconsistent weather has really challenged the yield of crops and the spirit of many an allotmenteer!

Even speaking to my colleagues and friends with allotments in other areas, we all came to the same conclusion that it been a bad year!

It therefore felt rather cathartic picking the last of the produce (leeks and red cabbages) before putting the ground to bed for a few months and clearing the site.

We have covered much of the plot in the hope of making headway into controlling the couch grass. When doing some research into couch grass (or witch grass, one of the other names for it), I read that medieval Northern Europe used the dried rhizomes as a type of incense when other resins types were not readily available. So my next guestion, 'is the Hagley Village Market ready for incense made of Hagley allotment witch grass?!' We had planned on just leaving the plot covered for the winter months, but I couldn't resist the pull of a little bit of growing. We have some onions and shallots to go in as well as some gifted brassicas - the timing of the planting is seemingly a little tricky at present with the rotating chance of snow or torrential rain and wind - but I am hoping for a few hours of neither of these that also coincide with not being at work at the time. Keeping everything crossed!

A rather drier indoor activity has been planting my Matucana sweet pea seeds. These were a phenomenal success in my garden last year, so I plan to put some of the plants in the plot this year too. They have an incredibly intense heady scent and will bring some lovely colour to the allotment. Not long til Spring!
