

HAGLEY HISTORICAL AND FIELD SOCIETY

On 4th February we welcome Mary Bodfish, presenting 'Early Years at Soho'. You might know the gilded bronze statue of three entrepreneurs in Centenary Square, Birmingham, known locally as "the Golden Boys." In the 1760s, entrepreneur Matthew Boulton chose a site near Hockley Brook in Handsworth to build his home and factory. Initially, he produced small metal goods called "toys," pioneering mass production with an assembly line approach. His work took a major leap when he met James Watt and William Murdock, and the factory expanded to produce steam engines that pumped water out of mines. This engaging and insightful talk will explore the crucial role that Boulton, Watt, Murdock, and the Soho factory played in kickstarting the Industrial Revolution.

On 4th March, we are pleased to welcome local musician and storyteller Dr. Richard Churchley back to entertain us with 'A Century of Popular Songs: 1860s to 1960s'

Join Richard as he takes you on a musical journey through the decades, singing some of your favourite songs and sharing fun facts about their historical context. You'll get to enjoy a bit of nostalgia, whether it's from hearing these tunes on the radio or remembering when they were sung by our parents and grandparents. We encourage lots of audience participation, and with great music you're sure to have a fun night!

ACTIVE SENIORS

Do your bones need some exercise? Not just your body but specifically your bones? We perhaps think of how we need to exercise for our muscles or our heart but possibly not exercises that helps to keep our bone density on track. The Royal Osteoporosis Society (theros.org.uk) reminds us that bones are made of living tissues but as we get older, we start to lose bone strength. The good news is that staying active and incorporating exercise into our week can help to keep our bones strong and less likely to break.

So what should we do? Exercise should (ideally) be weight bearing with some impact and include muscle strengthening exercises. Exercises that involve a range of movements in different directions and at different speeds are ideal but of course we also need to work on our balance as most fractures occur when we should reduce our falls risk and therefore our fracture risk.

I would recommend everyone check out the Royal Osteoporosis Society website – not just if you have been diagnosed with the condition but for information about how to check your risk factors and how to keep your bones strong. Of course the strength and balance classes held at the community centre each week are a good place to start too!

HAGLEY PROBUS CLUB

On November 26 did anyone see Sir Oliver Cromwell in Hagley? Well, I did, along with 44 others who were members and guests at our November meeting. His presence was in the persona of Max Keen, a retired history teacher, who dressed in the uniform of Cromwell. complete with spurs and helmet.

Before becoming involved in politics, Cromwell (nee 1599) was a farmer in Huntingdon, married with 9 children. These were turbulent times, with the country divided by religion and the King at odds with Parliament. In 1629 Charles I dissolved Parliament and at this point Cromwell, being opposed to the King's autocratic rule, joined the uprising against him and Civil War broke out. Cromwell raised an army, and the first battle of the War was fought at Powick Bridge. Subsequent battles were fought at Marston

Moore and then at Naseby in 1647 when the Royalists were routed. Charles I was executed, and Charles II became King but was defeated at the battle of Worcester and fled to France. England then became a Commonwealth. Cromwell died in 1658.



Games take place every Tuesday at 10.30am (weather permitting). Everyone who turns up is guaranteed a game - the number in each team and the size of the pitch is adjusted accordingly. The only rule is 'just turn up on Tuesday for 10.30am' - no prior notice or future commitment required. HAGLEY STRING ORCHESTRA

One of the pieces we are playing this term is a version of Mozart's String Quartet No 19, sometimes referred to as the 'Dissonance' Quartet. It is unusual to think of Mozart and dissonance in the same sentence, because he is normally associated with the height of classical elegance and harmony. However, the slow opening of this quartet certainly raises an eyebrow or two, containing harmonic progressions that you would not expect to hear before the 20th century.

Indeed, the publisher in 1785 returned the score assuming there must be multiple copying errors. 'Barbarous, and 'execrable' were two words used by reviewers at the time to describe the opening of the quartet. Haydn, to whom the quartet is dedicated, defended Mozart claiming that, "if Mozart wrote it, he must have meant it".



BEE KEEPING
