HAGLEY HISTORICAL AND FIELD SOCIETY

On 4th March, we are pleased to welcome local musician and storyteller Dr. Richard Churchley back to entertain us with 'A Century of Popular Songs: 1860s to 1960s.' Join Richard as he takes you on a musical journey through the decades, singing some of your favourite songs and sharing fun facts about their historical context. You'll get to enjoy a bit of nostalgia, whether it's from hearing these tunes on the radio or remembering when they were sung by our parents and grandparents. We encourage lots of audience participation, and with great music you're sure to have a fun night!

On April 1st, join us for a talk by Alan Hill, a retired manufacturing systems consultant, on 'The Great Exhibition of 1851.' Held in Hyde Park, London, from May to October 1851, this international event was organized by Prince Albert and Henry Cole (who invented the

Christmas card). It aimed to showcase Britain's industrial leadership. The exhibition's iconic building was a marvel of iron and glass, built in just 8 months using modular, prefabricated design and was made almost exclusively in Birmingham and Smethwick. Six million people attended, and enjoyed displays like the velocipede (precursor to the bicvcle), the image telegraph (early fax machine), and the world's first pu lic toilets!

RAIL SERVICE - STOURBRIDGE LINE USER GROUP

Any readers that have used the train service from Hagley station will be aware that the timetable has varied considerably over the years as has the standard of train service on offer. Last year Hagley saw the reintroduction of regular through services beyond Kidderminster to Hartlebury, Droitwich and Hagley's county town of Worcester cutting out, on average, a 15 minute wait for Hagley passengers at Kidderminster for these destinations. What may not be so well known is that this improvement was very much down to the championing of this change by a group of volunteers dedicated to improving the train service along the Stourbridge railway line. This group is the Stourbridge Line User Group or SLUG for short. They independently monitor all things connected with the train service and meet regularly with train operators and planners as well as government bodies. like West Midlands Rail Executive, to press and lobby for improvements. These improvements do not just involve the current train service

but also involve long term strategic planning discussions with the various authorities. Currently they are in discussion about the best use of the rail corridor from Stourbridge through Brierley Hill and Dudley to Wednesbury and their independently produced paper on the subject has been included in a current feasibility study being carried out by Transport for West Midlands. Other more immediate issues being championed are better Sunday services and better direct train services between Kidderminster, Stourbridge and London. SLUG membership costs a very modest sum for a year so if any local residents are interested in supporting their work or even become involved in their campaigns, they would be most welcome as members. The quarterly newsletter has been recognised nationally in recent years and has won a number of awards as best rail user group newsletter in the UK. THE FRIENDS OF THE CHURCH OF ST JOHN BAPTIST HAGLEY - CELEBRATING 45 YEARS

In the 1100's a small stone church was built in the grounds of Hagley Hall. Over the years new churches were built and improved and enlarged so that today St John's Church is a beautiful place to visit, sitting next to Hagley Hall, the Deer Park and Hagley Cricket Club. In the 1970's the Church needed much repair and faced closure as the Parochial Church Council (PCC) did not have sufficien funds for repairs etc. However, a small group of people were determined to keep the Church open and set about raising much needed funds. To ensure ongoing repair and maintenance a Trust Deed was set up in 1980 called "The Friends of St John". The Aims and Objects of the Trust Deed were set and these can be viewed on the Charity Commission website: https://registerof-charities.charitycommission.gov.uk/en/ charity-search/-/charity-details/5194161/ governing-document

Despite the Pandemic and with continuing help from the local community "The Friends" continue to raise, many thousands of pounds to ensure this beautiful Church remains a focal point in the life Hagley Village. This year "The Friends" are celebrating both it's 45th birthday and also a new beginning post Pandemic. The Trustees of "The Friends" will be considering how best to ensure St John's remains an important part of Village Life. To begin these celebrations, Eva Corlett will, in June, be hosting a very special Coffee Morning in St John's at which Michael Jones, the celebrated organist and pianist will be playing. Other events will take place later in the year. Finally, St John's and the Churchyard are open every day, why not pop along to see how peaceful and lovely it is - you will be surprised.

HAGLEY HOBBLERS

The group, now largely self run, was established in 2022 under a wider walking football initiative by Bromsgrove and Redditch District Council, with support from Hagley Parish Council. Initial funding paid for the necessary equipment (footballs, playing bibs etc). The group was brought together and run for the first 3 months by volunteer Alex Cooke and since then has been largely self run with District and Parish Council support. The facilities at Hagley Playing Fields, both the Pavilion and the playing fields, are provided by Hagley Parish Council, and West Hagley Football Club supply goal posts and flags. Games take place every Tuesday at 10.30am (weather permitting). Everyone who turns up is guaranteed a game - the number in each team and the size of the pitch is adjusted accordingly. The only rule is 'just turn up on Tuesday for 10.30am' - no prior notice or future commitment required. The rules of walking football are fairly simple, with some appropriate adjustments from ordinary football - mainly 'no running'!

BLAKEDOWN & HAGLEY TENNIS CLUB



If you have not heard of him before, he was a Czech composer and violinist (1874-1935) who was reputed to be a favourite student of Dvorak. In fact, he became 'family' when he married Dvorak's daughter. Strangely, he was awarded a silver medal at the 1932 Olympics, not for any sporting prowess, but for a piece of music (a symphonic march called, 'into a new life'). However, the honour was a back-handed compliment as no gold medal was awarded. suggesting that the judges didn't think the

piece worthy of the ultimate accolade. I would recommend listening to the 'Serenade', though, as it's defini ely gold medal standard. 

HAGLEY PATIENTS PARTICIPATION GROUP (PPG)

At our January meeting with the senior clinician team, we asked about the new triage system. Triage is a process where the clinicians try to allocate resources based on the type of problems presented and clinical need. Patients will be asked to fill in an online form to detail what their concerns or problems are. This will then be looked at by the GP who will then decide the appropriate clinical action. The doctor or reception team will reply to the patient with either a prescription, telephone appointment, face to face appointment or clinical advice. If you wish, you can still phone up the surgery, where a reception care navigator will take the information and add it to the triage list. This new system will allow doctors to decide which is the

most appropriate type of appointment for each patient and will be clinician led. You are still able to call up the surgery as normal and ask the team to take your details. The main difference is that the receptions will not be able to book appointments directly and will respond back once the clinician has looked at the problem. The surgery is hoping that this new model will allow more timely appointments for those with most need and to make use of the wider clinical team to help with ensure the best clinical care.

We transport, by motorcycle or car, urgently needed items such as blood, medicines and samples across Worcestershire, as well as Gloucestershire, North Wiltshire and Herefordshire. We also partner with other blood bike groups across the country to relay samples across regions. Nine emergency service bikes and four cars are available 365 days a year, with members working weekdays, evenings and at weekends and Bank Holidays, we provide a 24-hour service to the NHS. Founded in 2007, Severn Freewheelers has grown in membership from one motorcycle and five volunteers to the current fleet size and over 180 members. Representing a variety of people from many walks of life, member roles include motorbike riders, car drivers, despatchers and fundraisers. We are funded entirely by generous donations from the

Where's faith when we need it? Romans 10:17 – "So faith comes from hearing the message, and the message comes from the Word of God." I could tell you about countless difficul and drawn-out circumstances over which I have tried to stand firmly in faith until they finally came to pass. Sometimes I made it and sometimes I was weak and began to doubt. But God mercifully came through for me on

these things, despite my lack of strength to stay faithful. Much of what we describe as 'faith' has nothing to do with Biblical faith. Our faith must not be based on emotion, or want, and not on the latest exciting ideas or revival. But it must be centred on God's Word, on Jesus Christ, His death and resurrection, His salvation!
